Jason Vanlandingham has been on an incredible winning streak in recent years. The NRHA Million Dollar Rider and his wife, Adrienne, own and operate Vanlandingham Reining Horses located in Whitesboro, Texas.

To date Jason has accumulated many Futurity and Derby Championships, including the coveted NRHA Open Futurity and NRHA Open Derby titles, as well as the NRBC Championship, and Top 5 finishes at every major NRHA event. Clinic cost is \$200 per horse and rider combination or \$25 per non-riding auditor with all tuition proceeds going to the two charities.
